

Jody Jensen is the director of international relations at the Institute of Social and European Studies which she helped to found. She is also a senior research fellow at the Institute of Political Sciences at the Hungarian Academy of Sciences. She has also served as an assistant professor in international economics at the Corvinus University of Budapest. For many years she was the Hungarian and then regional director of the international NGO Ashoka: Innovators for the Public which supports social entrepreneurship around the world. More recently she has also frequently lectured abroad and also does consultancy works for the European Commission in Brussels for the Jean Monnet Program and the Erasmus Mundus Program. Her major fields of research and publication include globalization, global governance, transformation of the nation state, governing global markets and global civil society. Dr. Jensen taught in China for two years at the Southwest People's University in Sichuan Province. She engaged in graduate studies for two years at the University of Copenhagen as a Marshall Fund grant recipient and as a Fulbright Scholar, and received her PhD in International Economic Relations at the Corvinus University of Budapest.
